## SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**FIRST READING: ISAIAH 62:1-5**

Isaiah prophesizes that Jerusalem will again be held in high esteem by God. He states that all nations will witness its glory. He compares a groom's joy toward his bride to the joy that God will feel toward Jerusalem.

**SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 12:4-11**

Paul discusses the different gifts and talents bestowed upon different individuals. He explains that each individual receives various talents so that everyone can contribute something to society.

**GOSPEL: JOHN 2:1-11**

Jesus and Mary attended a wedding where Mary informed Jesus that there was no more wine. At first he said it did not concern him, but then he turned several jugs of water into wine. His disciples were also present, and believed in him more strongly after they witnessed the first sign of glory he revealed to them.

## CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

**BAPTISM:** The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

**CONFIRMATION:** "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

**MATRIMONY:** Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS:** For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, year C, offers us much to reflect upon and much to act upon. I have often been struck by the words of Mary, mother of Jesus, in the Gospel, John 2:1-11 at the marriage feast at Cana. To the servants she said, "Do whatever he tells you." I imagine these words spoken to me or to all of us. What has the Lord told me to do?



Sure there are obvious answers to this question: to minister as a priest, to serve in the parish I am assigned, to share the word of God and many more such things. But I ask myself, "What is at the heart of all these actions?" The Lord has asked me to love all his people. Like you, sometimes this is difficult to do. Neither Mary nor Jesus said, "Love only those who love you or who you find it easy to love." Jesus would say, "Love your enemies, do good to those who persecute you." In this time, when many people take offense easily, or respond with very harsh words, we would do well to remember the words of Mary and Jesus. Remember His first sign was at the marriage feast in Cana. He truly blessed this couple and family with the abundance of choice wine. In the first reading, this Sunday from Isaiah, the prophet calls the land and people of Israel, "a delight and espoused," to the Lord God. All of us have been blest by the Lord and we have gifts to share for the building up of God's Kingdom. Let us use these gifts for the good of others and the building up of God's Kingdom here at Annunciation Catholic Church.

## FEAST JANUARY 23

Barbara Koob was born in Germany, and moved to the United States with her family when she was 2. She entered the Sisters of St. Francis in Syracuse, N.Y., serving for 20 years as a teacher and hospital administrator. In 1883 she traveled with six sisters to Hawaii to minister to people with Hansen's disease, then known as leprosy. In 1888, they opened a home on Molokai for women and girls with the disease, and continued the work of St. Damien de Veuster after his death. Mother Marianne died on Molokai; her feast is her birthday. At her canonization in 2012, Pope Benedict XVI called her "a shining example of the tradition of Catholic nursing sisters and of the spirit of her beloved St. Francis."

Patrick was born without eyes and without the ability to walk. His parents gave him music lessons whereby he learned to play the piano and trumpet. When he graduated high school, he desired to play in the marching band of the University of Louisville in Louisville, KY. His father, Patrick Hughes, supported his son in his efforts by attending all of the band's rehearsals to learn their formations and push his son around the field as Patrick played his instrument. He likewise attended all of the football games and elsewhere the band played. They did this for approx. 4 yrs until Patrick graduated college. A movie was made about their inspiring story which was awarded the 2015 Dove Award. They have since toured nationally and internationally giving motivational speeches on overcoming life's challenges to show that all life has potential; hence, the title of the movie, "I Am Potential." This event is FREE; however, a goodwill donation will be collected.
