TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 25:6-10A

This passage describes the new Jerusalem as a heavenly banquet on the mountain with the Lord God wiping away all tears.

SECOND READING: PHILIPPIANS 4:12-14, 19-20

In simple, direct words, Paul thanks the Philippians for alleviating his hardships. He stresses, though, that he is as accustomed to poverty as to abundance and finds all his strength in Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

Once more speaking to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus relates the parable of the wedding banquet. A King, preparing a wedding banquet for his son, summons all the invited guests. When, after several invitations, no guests arrive, the King commands his servants to "go out into the byroads and invite anyone you come upon." Again, Jesus warns the elders, "the invited are many, the elect are few."

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

SAINT IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH

Feast Day - October 17

This Syrian-born martyr, who gave himself the nickname "Godbearer" because of his certainty of God's presence within him and who may have been a disciple of St. John the Evangelist, became bishop of Antioch about 69. Eventually he was arrested and sent to Rome, where his strong desire for martyrdom was fulfilled when he was thrown to the lions in the Colosseum. In seven letters written to Christians in Asia Minor and Rome, he stressed the need to heal church conflicts, the authority of local bishops and the Eucharist as a source of unity.



Donations for the month of October will benefit the Gabriel Network to provide loving services to women and families challenged with a crisis pregnancy. Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I wish to report to you the Fiscal 2019 – 2020 Yearly report. Like most institutions, this past year has been very difficult on our parishioners and the administration of the parish. I want to begin by acknowledging my great appreciation for your generosity and dedication to Annunciation Catholic Church. We have been able to maintain most of our services and have sought new ways to reach out to minister to one another. Limitations have been imposed on us for our own good and the good of others. We have become more aware of our connectedness and the need to work for the common good. This is reflected in our income and expenses. With less people attending Church services we have seen a significant decrease in our offertory collections and the funds needed to maintain the church. We have also had extra expenses in making sure the Church is a safe place to gather.

We have seen an increase of parishioners who are participating in the Faith Direct program in which you may make your contribution online. Thank you, to those who have done so and I invite those who have not to please consider joining them by going to https://membership.faithdirect.net/enroll. You can then enter our Parish Name and Washington DC. This will take you to the site that will enable you make continuous giving or a one-time gift.

You may ask how we have been able to meet our expenses with reduced income. We have done so by drawing on our endowment funds. We have not touched the Principal but have drawn on the Interest. This is not something that I would desire to do but when necessary it is unavoidable. Our investments took a hit because of the down turn in the economy. You will also see a decrease in the number of households in the parish. We have removed from our list those people who were receiving envelopes but had not used them in years. The smaller number of sacraments celebrated are accounted for by the postponing of those sacraments this year.

On the positive side we have seen an increase in the number of people attending mass. Please sign up through Flocknotes to register at which mass you would like to attend. Our school will be receiving small groups of students each day. The remaining days they will continue to receive their studies online. There will be no more than 40 students at school on any single day. Our school has also established a Global Initiative, to reach out to students in other areas of our country and world. We are in the process of upgrading our internet connection and Wi-Fi capabilities. But our greatest source of strength is our Faith in the Lord God and in the promise that Jesus would be with us all of our days.

May God bless you and hold you close to His heart. We ask this through the intercession of Mary our Mother.
