## TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### FIRST READING: WISDOM 7:7-11

This poem discusses how the spirit of wisdom is far more beautiful than any riches could be. All gold is no more than sand when compared to the importance of wisdom, which often leads people to the other good things in life.

## **CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS**

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

As promised, I will share with you the thoughts and sentiments of Parishioners who on Friday, September 21st, after our parish Stations of the Cross service, gathered in a large number to pray, listen, and talk about the abuse crisis impacting the




Church. Many parishioners courageously and humbly expressed how personally hurt and betrayed they have felt by the Church in recent weeks, in light of all the sexual abuse allegations and cover-ups that have been revealed. Faith remains strong, but many people expressed their sense of a large disconnect between the Church's teachings and preaching, and the actual behavior of clerics, and the crisis has shaken many people and their trust in the institutional structures of the Church. A number of parishioners are originally from other dioceses where great abuses took place, and so the specific cases of abuse are deeply personal for many. Overall, there is great anger at the bishops collectively for what seems like systemic cover-ups of criminal abusive behavior, as well as a great sense of frustration for the bishops' lack of engagement of the laity in the power structures of the Church over many decades. But even in the midst of great anger, Annunciation parishioners remain resolute and committed to helping the Church heal and reform, and parishioners expressed a strong desire to work for positive changes in our own parish and local Church. Suggestions of concrete steps Annunciation parish can undertake include offering regularly scheduled parish town hall meetings, stronger communication between parishioners through voluntary list serves, greater engagement of parishioners in the life of the Church, and more substantial involvement by the laity in decisions that impact the archdiocesan church of Washington, all in the hope and deep conviction that such measures will help Annunciation grow as a community of faith.

We recorded the email address of those parishioners who wished to be part of a "list serve" so they may have a forum to express their concerns and to keep informed on the progress of reform, reparation and healing which is so greatly needed. 

## JOHN DE BREBEUF

1593-1649

#### FEAST OCTOBER 19

Born in Normandy in 1593, John entered the Jesuits in 1617 and was ordained in 1622. Despite having tuberculosis, he went as a missionary to New France (Canada) in 1625. He had little success among the Huron Indians, and returned briefly to France when Canada became English. But in 1633 he undertook a second mission and lived with the Hurons for 15 years, producing the first Huron dictionary. In 1649, he and Jesuit Father Gabriel Lalemant were captured in a raid by Iroquois warriors. After indescribable tortures, John died March 16 and Gabriel March 17. They are among the eight Jesuit North American martyrs, the patron saints of Canada and North America whose joint U.S. feast is October 19.
