SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The Lord tells Moses and Aaron that anyone bearing the sore of leprosy must first be seen by Aaron or one of the other priests, and that as long as the sore is upon him, "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Paul instructs the Corinthians to do everything for the glory of God, to avoid offending others, and to be imitators of Christ.

GOSPEL: MARK 1:40-45

Jesus takes pity on a leper and cures him of his disease with a warning not to say but to show himself to the priest and make an offering. Instead of remaining silent, the leper greatly publicized the healing, making it impossible for Jesus to enter the town openly.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Penitential Season of Lent is nearly upon us. Ash Wednesday is February 17th. We will have Mass with the distribution of Ashes at 8:00am and 11:00am and 7:00pm. This year, in light of the directives from Rome, we will sprinkle ashes on the top of each individual's head. We will not be placing a cross on your forehead. The formula, "Repent and believe in the Gospel or Remember you are



dust and to dust you shall return," will only be said one time for the entire community at each Mass. These few days before Lent begins are a good time to reflect on how we will prepare ourselves and live out these Forty Days. Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving are the three main actions that we do to prepare ourselves for the Solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection.

We will have daily Mass at 8:00am and 11:00am, Monday through Friday, 9:00am on Saturday, Saturday evening Mass for Sunday is at 5:30pm and Sunday at 8:00am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. The Sacrament of Confession will be Wednesdays from 11:30am to 12:30pm and 6:30pm to 7:30pm and Saturday 4:15pm to 5:15pm. Stations of the Cross will be Fridays at 7:00pm.


For members of the Latin (Roman) Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. There are many opportunities to fast on other days in Lent in addition to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Lent is a season to make sacrifices and penitential acts.

I hope many of you are taking the opportunity to receive the Covid vaccine. If you need assistance, we at the parish office may be available to assist you. Please let us know. Most of our staff will have received their first vaccination shot by the end of the week.

Finally, thank you to all who made a contribution to the 2021 Annual Appeal. Materials and information will be available in the vestibule of the Church if you are in need of such. You will be receiving a mailing from us through the Archdiocese of Washington. Please make a sacrificial pledge to assist your brothers and sisters in need.

May you always know and experience the love of God for you, especially on Saint Valentine's Day through the love of others.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK



Blessed Francisco & Jacinta Marto

20th century

FEAST FEBRUARY 20

Two of the three Fatima visionaries, this sister and brother were beatified in 2000. With their cousin, Lucia dos Santos, they had monthly visions of Mary at Fatima, Portugal, from May to October 1917. Mary asked the shepherd children to promote devotion to her Immaculate Heart and pray the rosary daily. Both Martos died of influenza, Francisco at age 10 in 1919, and Jacinta at age 9 in 1920. Their cousin, who became a Carmelite nun, died in 2005 at age 97. Fatima is among the world's great Marian shrines and pilgrimage sites.

SHROVE TUESDAY

also known as... FAT TUESDAY = MARDI GRAS = PANCAKE DAY

It is a tradition to eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. Shrove comes from the word "shrive", meaning to confess, or tell God we are sorry for our sins. Pancakes use up food items that were not permitted during Lent in the Middle Ages - milk, eggs, fat, butter and meat. Lent begins tomorrow - Let's eat pancakes today!

Homemade Pancakes



SIFT	MIX IN
1 1/4 cup flour	1 beaten egg
3 teaspoons baking powder	1 cup milk
2 tablespoons sugar	2 tablespoons vegetable oil
1/2 teaspoon salt	

Cook on greased, hot skillet. Flip when bubbles appear and pop. Makes 8, 4" pancakes — Serving with butter, syrup, fruit or meat is optional.
