THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15

Moses came upon a burning bush, when God called out to him. God told Moses that he had seen the suffering of his people in Egypt, and intended to lead them from their captors to a land of milk and honey. Moses asked what he should say if the Israelites should ask what God wished to be called. God replied, "I am who am."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

Paul describes how the people were led into the desert by Moses, yet many of them were struck down by God. He warns that this should serve as an example not to give in to wicked desires or we may suffer the same downfall.

GOSPEL: LUKE 13:1-9

Jesus says that an individual's misfortune does not mean that their sins were greater than someone else's. He warns that without repenting, all sinners will meet the same end. He tells of a barren fig tree whose owner planned to cut it down. But a servant offered to give it special care for one year, and destroy it should it remain barren. This symbolizes God's patience toward us.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

Luke 13:1-9, provides us with the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent Year C.

The narratives of disaster experienced by the Galileans who were killed by Pilate and those killed by the falling tower at Siloam are warnings that Jesus is going to Jerusalem to face his own death. Those who were killed did nothing wrong and neither did Jesus and yet he will face death. What do we make of this parable regarding the fig tree? It usually takes a fig tree two to six years before it will bear



fruit. The soil, the sun, and the water have a significant impact whether the tree will thrive. Since this tree is not providing fruit, the owner told his gardener to cut it down. The gardener responds that he will give it more care and time and it may provide figs. In our lives the Lord gives us time to repent and make our lives fruitful in heeding the message of Christ to turn back to the Lord. This time does not go on indefinitely; it has a limit to it. Now is the acceptable time, now is the day of our salvation. Lent is the proper season to experience the mercy of the Lord and make Him the center of our lives.

Annunciation of the Lord

FEAST MARCH 25

According to the revised New American Bible, the Annunciation, when the angel Gabriel tells Mary she has been chosen to be the mother of God, the Son, is the exact moment of the Incarnation. The encounter, with Mary's questioning and acceptance, is described in Luke 1: 26-38. This liturgical feast, first celebrated in the East, was introduced in Rome between 660 and 680. The oldest liturgical books called "Adnuntiatio Domini," the Annunciation of the Lord, but during the Middle Ages it was popularly celebrated as a Marian feast, the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary. The 1969 revision of the Roman liturgical calendar restored the feast as a solemnity of the Lord and restored its ancient title..
