FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 43:16-21

God says not to remember the events from long ago, but to focus on the things he plans to do next. He also claims he will again help his chosen people when they need him.

SECOND READING: PHILIPPIANS 3:8-14

Paul describes knowledge of Jesus as more important than knowledge of the Old Law. He wishes to share in the power of Jesus' resurrection, and speaks of concentrating on the finish line of the race with salvation as the prize to be won.

GOSPEL: JOHN 8:1-11

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

In preparation for the upcoming Holy Week services, April 14 to 21, I would like to share with you some reflections. This is truly a time for us to turn our attention to the God who saves us and asks us to invite others to come to know the love God has for all people. The word Gospel means, "Good News." Jesus is the Good News of our heavenly Father.

We begin with Passion Sunday often called Palm Sunday. We will read in Scripture of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It is here that the Jewish



people proclaim him Messiah. We receive palm branches which many people take home and place near a Crucifix or religious picture. Some people sit in the pew and weave a cross out of the strip of palm so they may wear it or place it in their home. We participate in the reading of the Passion story of Jesus suffering and death.

On Thursday we begin the Triduum or three days. Holy Thursday night we have Mass and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. You will notice we begin in the regular fashion but there is no final blessing but we will have Adoration until 11 PM. On Holy Thursday we commemorate the institution of the Eucharist and our commission to be of service to all. On Good Friday we enter in silence and there is no sign of the cross or penitential rite. Again we participate in the proclamation of the Passion, venerate the cross, we receive communion which has been consecrated the night before and we depart in silence. On Holy Saturday night we begin with the blessing of the new fire and lighting of the new Paschal Candle; we celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation, (Baptism if any, Confirmation and Holy Communion), renew our baptismal promises, and joyously sing out Alleluia with a final blessing.

On the mornings of Thursday, Friday and Saturday, we will join people throughout the world who pray the Liturgy of the Hours with Morning Prayer. This is new for our parish but has been done in the church for centuries. Please come and start the day in union with your brothers and sisters in prayer.

Invite your family and friends to any and all these celebrations; all are welcome. We are open to all people and wish you to share in our joy and love for the Lord God. Refer to the bulletin for the times of each of these celebrations as well as confession.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Casilda

11th century FEAST **APRIL 9**

Born in central Spain, Casilda was the daughter of the emir of Toledo. Though a Muslim, she had a reputation for being kind to Christian prisoners. After she became sick, she went on a pilgrimage to the shrine of San Vicenzo de Briviesca, which was famous for its healing waters. She was cured and became a Christian, embarking on a life of solitude and penance in a cell near the shrine. Her name eventually was added to the shrine's name, and she reputedly lived to the age of 100. In 1750 her remains were transferred to a new shrine.


