FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas addressed many people, and large crowds gathered to hear them. Some of the Jews became jealous, and argued with whatever Paul said. But Paul and Barnabas continued preaching their message of salvation and everlasting life, until they were eventually forced to leave the town.

Second Reading: Revelation 7:9, 14b-17

John saw a vision of many people surrounding a throne and the Lamb. One of the elders told him these were the people who had survived great periods of trial, but maintained strong faith in God. Now they would receive eternal protection and comfort from God as reward for their loyalty.

Gospel: John 10:27-30

Jesus states that his sheep know his voice and follow him, and will receive eternal life. Jesus also says that no one can snatch his followers away, because God is greater than anyone who might try, and Jesus is one with God.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The reading from Revelation (7:9, 14b-17) gives us a picture of what was happening in the early Church as John was writing this sacred book. There was a great deal of persecution at the time and many people who put their trust in the Lord Jesus found themselves in harsh conditions. Being faithful to the Lamb of God, they were lifted up to the presence of God and lived forever under his care. All of us know of the great struggle our church is going through, not only opposition from those who are not



believers but also from the sins of believers as well. We hear many reasons for the decline in Mass attendance and those who have turned away from the Church. Many of these reasons have some truth to them. It cannot be just one thing but a combination: how priests and bishops see themselves, a lack of morality among many people, a society that emphasizes one's own will over the will of God, and the list goes on. It is truly a challenge to each of us. We are on the verge of receiving a new Archbishop for the Church of Washington, Wilton Gregory on May 21. It is now the time to pray for him and strive to live better lives ourselves. Each of us lives in union with the other and all our actions have effects beyond solely ourselves, both good and bad. I am certain that Jesus Christ will not leave his Church to flounder and fail. He will lift us up and give us strength to be renewed and thrive. May we not give into discouragement but make every effort to live faithfully to the word of God and truly believe, "God will wipe away every tear from [our] eyes."

We are going to have a seminarian with us for 6 weeks in the summer. Nathaniel Roberts is finishing his First Pre-Theology year at St. John Paul II Seminary. Nathaniel will start on May 20th. Please pray for him and all seminarians and women and men preparing for consecrated life.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Our Lady of Fatima

20th Century

FEAST MAY 13

Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a "bishop in white" shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Saint John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him. At the Vatican last October 13, Pope Francis stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary.


