# TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### FIRST READING: GENESIS 3:9-15

God asked Adam why he ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. Adam blames his companion, who in turn blames a serpent. God then told the serpent it would be banned from other animals, and be an enemy of humanity.

## SECOND READING: II CORINTHIANS 4:13-5:1

Paul describes our belief that "He who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus." Although our bodies grow weaker, each day our inner strength grows. Paul also describes our burdens as light when compared to the eternal rewards we can attain.

#### **GOSPEL: MARK 3:20-35**

Some of the scribes felt that Jesus was possessed and claimed that he expelled demons with help from Satan. Jesus silenced them by asking, "How can Satan expel Satan?" Jesus also warned them that although many sins would be forgiven, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit would not. Jesus was then told that his mother, brother and sisters were asking for him. He asked, "Who are my mother and brother and sisters? Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." This demonstrates Jesus' deep love for all those who love God.

# CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

# OUR NEW PASTOR—MSGR, MICHAEL MELLONE

Monsignor Michael Mellone, our newly named pastor, has served at St. Mary of the Mills Parish in Laurel since 2011. He is a native of Hackensack, N.J., and was ordained in 1976. He attended Cathedral College of the Immaculate Conception in New York prior to entering Theological College to complete his seminary studies. He has served as a parochial vicar



at St. Catherine Labouré Parish, Wheaton; Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish, Washington; Our Lady of Mercy Parish, Potomac; and St. John the Evangelist Parish, Clinton. He has served as pastor of St. Andrew Apostle Parish; St. Peter Claver Parish, St. Inigoes; St. Martin of Tours Parish, Gaithersburg; and St. Thomas Apostle Parish, Washington. He also served from 2003 to 2006 as archdiocesan secretary for clergy. He previously served as a member of the Consultors, the Planning and Evaluation Commission for Catholic Schools, the Priest Council, the Vocations Formation Board, the Convocation Committee, the Retirement Board, the Continuing Education of Priests and the Deacon Council. A former episcopal vicar in Montgomery County, he served as dean of the Upper Montgomery County Deanery in 2009.

# ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

1195-1231

FEAST JUNE 13

Saint Anthony of Padua (Portuguese: St. António de Lisboa), born Fernando Martins de Bulhões also known as Anthony of Lisbon, was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church on 16 January 1946. He is also the patron saint of lost things.
