## CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

**BAPTISM:** The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

**CONFIRMATION:** "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

**MATRIMONY:** Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS:** For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

### Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It was a joy to see so many of you at Mass this past weekend. I earnestly ask that you use the Flocknote sign-up (included below and also available on our website) to sign up for which Mass you will attend each week. The reason for this is that we have a capacity for 80 people in Church to pray safely and for contact tracing if needed. Thank you for your faithfulness in worshiping the Lord both in person



and virtually. Remember you can place an offering in the basket at the door of the church if you are at Mass, send or bring it to the parish office, or send it electronically through Faith Direct (link below).

The reading for the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time speaks to us of fraternal correction and how we are to live with and treat one another. All of our lives should be guided by the Commandments of the Lord. Jesus sums them up as loving God with our whole heart, soul, mind, and strength and to love our neighbors as yourself. Notice He does not make a distinction as to who is our neighbor. We are all created by God and should treat all people with dignity and respect. The Lord does not tell us to seek vengeance or retribution for the slights or hurts that others may bring upon us. With a very clear voice the Lord directs us away from violence, racism and the injustices that are fostered upon many people. The mark of the Christian is seeing how they love one another as stated in the Acts of the Apostles. Remember we must seek out personal correction of ourselves before we look to correct another. "Remove the beam from our own eye before we remove the speck from our brother's eye." All of this should be done with prayer and faithfully listening to the words of the Lord. We know and believe that the Lord will give us the grace to act prudently in his name and to make the sacrifices needed to see to the good of others.

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK



## Saint Teresa of Kolkata

1910-1997

Feast Day – September 7

Raised in a deeply Catholic family in Albania, Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu joined the Sisters of Loreto in 1928 and took the name Teresa. The community sent her to Kolkata, India, where she taught children for two decades. In 1946 Teresa heard God's call to quench the thirst of Jesus by caring for the poorest of the poor. She left the Sisters of Loreto to rescue the sick and destitute in the slums of Kolkata - one at a time. Many volunteers soon joined her and she formed them into her religious order, the Missionaries of Charity. Teresa's manifest goodness and her unique media savvy attracted global attention, drawing many people to God. Many regard her as the greatest Catholic evangelist of the 20th century. She was beatified in 2003 and canonized in 2016.

## 2020 Collection for the Holy Land

The current COVID-19 pandemic concerns many countries and in many of them preventive measures precluded the normal community celebration of Holy Week.

The Christian communities in the Holy Land, also exposed to the risk of contagion and living in contexts already full of serious sufferings, benefit every year from the generosity of the faithful from all over the world. This solidarity enables them to continue their evangelical presence, in addition to maintaining schools and social structures that assist all citizens with healthcare, education and peaceful coexistence, attending above all to the weakest and poorest.

For this reason, Pope Francis has approved the proposal that the Collection for the Holy Land, for the year 2020, take place on Sunday, September 13, near the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

The celebration that commemorates the discovery of the Relics of the Cross by Saint Helen also marks a new beginning of public worship in Jerusalem, with the construction of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre. May it be a sign of hope and salvation after the Passion to which many peoples are now associated, as well as solidarity with those who continue to live the Gospel of Jesus on the Land where "it all began".



## Gospel Today | 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mt 18:15-20

Jesus promises, "For where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst of them."

We call God to us when we gather in prayer, two or three or more! Most churches have a "prayer chain". Not a real chain, but a group of people who link up and pray together.

Make a personal prayer chain. Write your thanks, needs, forgiveness or requests to God, one on each link or strip of paper. Attach the links together to form a chain. Have other family members add their own links! Hang it in your home and during family prayer time, as two or three are gathered in Jesus' name, He will hear your prayer. If it is His will, it will be done.

#### DIRECTIONS -

**Step One** 

Cut the construction paper lengthwise into strips that are about an inch wide. They can be of pretty much any length, keeping in mind that the longer the strip, the bigger each link in the chain. Write your requests to God on each link.

**Step Two** 

Bend the first strip around to form a circle or loop.

Step Three

Seal the open ends of the circle link with glue, tape or a stapler so that it stays connected on its own.

**Step Four** 

Take another strip and thread it through the first loop forming a second, connected circle.

Step Five

Seal the second circle with glue, tape or a stapler so that you have two linked circles.

Step Six

Repeat Steps 4 and 5 to make the chain as long as you like.
