

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra gathered the people and read to them from the book of the Law of God. He interpreted the law clearly, so that everyone understood what he had read. He then told them to go and rejoice in the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

Paul explains that a body is composed of many different parts, and that each part has its' own purpose and is important. He compares this to the Church, describing how we are one body composed of many members. All members should show concern for each other and understand that we are all vital to the body as a whole.

GOSPEL: LUKE 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke discusses his decision to write about the events he and the other disciples had witnessed. He begins by telling of Jesus reading a passage from the book of Isaiah, where the anointed one is portrayed. Jesus finished by telling the people that they had seen that passage fulfilled in their hearing.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Our readings for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time begin with a reading from the Book of Nehemiah. Nehemiah was instrumental in the restoration of Jerusalem after the Babylonian Exile. Ezra in the same period centered in on the reestablishment of the worship and traditions that formed the Hebrew people. Knowing the words of the Lord, the Torah, and following the Lord's commands brings rejoicing to the returning ex-



iles. They are once again in the Promised Land and able, as a people, to give praise to their God.

In our Gospel from St. Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21 we witness the fulfillment of the promise to send the Messiah, the Anointed of the Lord, Jesus Christ. The events recorded in the Book of Nehemiah and the Gospel of Luke center in upon a community and not an individual. Even our second reading from Corinthians stresses the unity of the many members drawn together as one in Christ.

Our society often puts the importance of the individual in opposition to the community. The scriptures show how they both need to be in union with one another. The community finds its strength in the care of the individual and the good of the individual builds up the community. If we witness to the sanctity of each human life and care for the individual, the community becomes a haven of goodness and truth. May we see in our worship the coming together of individuals who rejoice in the company of one another and the Lord. Let us not be in isolation but witness to the reality of people who gather in prayer, strengthening the building up of the Body of Christ.

"The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away, blessed be the name of the Lord", Job 1:21. As Job realizes the truth that the Lord is the source of all blessings so each of us, also come to this truth. I want to thank you all for praying for my brother Joseph Cammarata. The Lord has called him forth from this life into eternity. I ask you to pray for his soul and for all the departed, may they now live in eternal light.

St. Thomas Aouinas

1225-1274

Feast Day - January 28

Thomas so shocked his noble Italian family when he entered the Dominicans about 1244 that his brothers imprisoned him for a year. But he would not yield, and studied under St. Albert the Great, becoming a master of theology in 1256. For the rest of his brief life, the "dumb ox," as he was dubbed, taught, preached and wrote, producing the monumental "Summa Theologica." His thinking became enormously influential in later centuries and he was named a Doctor of the Church in 1567.


