## PENTECOST SUNDAY

**FIRST READING: ACTS 2:1-11**

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

**SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 12:3b-7, 12-13**

Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, who was sent to us by God.

**GOSPEL: JOHN 20:19-23**

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.

## CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

**BAPTISM:** The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

**CONFIRMATION:** "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

**MATRIMONY:** Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS:** For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Our Deacon Grzegorz Okulewicz will be ordained to the priesthood on June 18 along with nine other deacons for the Archdiocese of Washington. On Sunday June 19, he will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 10AM at Annunciation with a reception to follow. You are most welcome to attend all of these events.

I have truly appreciated your continuing prayers for my wellbeing and recovery. I learned that I would need additional surgery on June 8. This will be less extensive, and I believe recovery will be quicker. I continue to ask for your prayers and understanding.

This weekend we celebrate the Birthday of the Church, the Feast of Pentecost. There are several options to choose as readings for our Mass. Rather than center on only one set, I will try to give some general thought that may lead to reflection.

The Spirit of God has been at work from the beginning of time. Genesis says that the Spirit, Breath of God, hovered over the waters, in one of the creation accounts. God is always a Trinity of three in One. In the time of the Apostles, God came down upon the disciples as tongues of flame, giving them the ability to speak so others may hear of the great work of Jesus Christ. The Spirit gave them great powers to heal and bring many unto the Lord.

This same Spirit is still at work in the Church calling all its members to manifest the presence of God in word and deed. We receive the Spirit in each of the Sacraments beginning with Baptism and a strengthening of the same Spirit at Confirmation. God is ever faithful and always keeps His word. In receiving the Sacrament, we are active participants. We cooperate with the Grace, life of God that is given to us. This Grace increases in us as we conform our will to that of the Lord's. It allows us to live in Him as He lives in us. As Church, we bring about the Kingdom of God as the Spirit guides us to witness to the presence of God. May each of us look to further our closeness to our Lord in our prayer and actions.

## ST. EPHRAEM

c. 306-373

Feast—**June 9th**

Known to Syrian Christians as “the harp of the Holy Ghost,” this Mesopotamian from Nisibia was baptized at 18 and may have accompanied his bishop to the Council of Nicaea in 325. He served as head of the cathedral school and left Nisibia only after it became Persian. In 363 he moved to a cave overlooking Edessa but preached frequently in the city and wrote many poems, hymns and biblical commentaries; he organized a choir of women to sing his hymns during liturgies. About 370 he visited St. Basil in Caesarea. The winter before his death, he earned praise for managing relief supplies during a severe famine in Edessa. Ephraem is the only Syrian father declared a doctor of the church.

## ANNUNCIATION PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

The Council came to order with prayer on May 24 at 7:05pm. Msgr. Mellone, John, Art, Tom, and Anita attended.

The Council discussed preparations for Glover Park Day and ways to involve the Church in the School's presence there, such as a box for prayer requests or a sign and postcards with Mass times. Such postcards were noted to be a broader need for the parish. The Council also suggested seeing if there was leftover swag from previous occasions like Father's Day.

Art updated the Council on the building project. The addition is complete and functional, with the elevator working and so forth. There is a water leak in the hall that runs from the elevator at the gym level; the leak's origin is unclear.

The addition needs furnishings and decorations, perhaps including prominent displays of sacred art. The Council discussed the cost of such a project and possible measures like using materials from the bazaar, talented individuals in the community, and the attic.

Handrails may be added to improve sanctuary accessibility.

The parish is still waiting on a September date for the carillon blessing by the Cardinal.

The church discussed holding a procession around the block after the noon mass on Corpus Christi. John is reaching out to St. Thomas about a larger procession next year.

Tom noted that the Mass times are obscured at the sign in front of the church; the Council discussed seasonal signs like the sign placed at Massachusetts and Klinge for Easter.

The Council discussed possible uses for the land to the church's southeast, such as an assisted living facility.

The Council discussed the need for more people in ministries, especially altar servers.

The Council plans to meet in June and take July and August off.

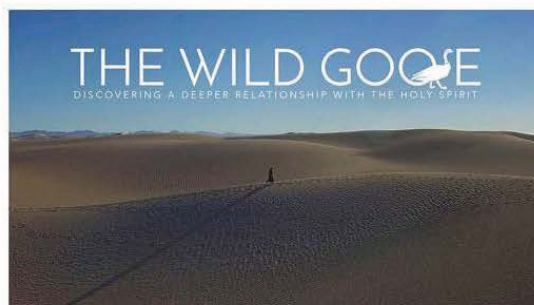
