Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3

Samuel describes how all the tribes of Israel went to David in Hebron and said they were his bone and his flesh and it was he who led them back to Israel. The Lord told David he would be a shepherd to His people. David made an agreement with the elders and was anointed king.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20

Paul explains to the Colossians that God has made them fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light and that through the Son we have redemption and forgiveness of sin. He describes Jesus as the image of the invisible God, the head of the church and in Him all things hold together.

Gospel: Luke 23:35-43

Jesus is mocked by the crowd as he hung on the cross. Above him was an inscription that read "This is the king of the Jews." One of the men being crucified with Jesus tells Him to save them and Himself, while the other asks that he be remembered when Jesus is in his kingdom. Jesus said in reply, "Amen I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We come to the last Sunday of the Church Year, the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Our Gospel for this Sunday is taken from Luke 23:35-43. There is much to reflect upon. Jesus is mocked by the leaders of the people, the soldiers, and one of the criminals crucified alongside Him. All three of these groups center in on the power of Jesus to save Himself and in the case of the criminal, he as well. They are looking for the



perpetuation of earthly life. They have put their hope only in this world.

Jesus on the other hand is looking forward to fulfilling the will of His Father and that is the salvation of all people unto the Heavenly Kingdom. The person known as the "Good Thief" seeks Paradise. This recalls the Garden of Eden before the fall of Adam and Eve. Jesus proclaims that this person will be with the Lord in His Kingdom; hence, our title for today's Solemnity, King of the Universe.

What do we long for in our lives? Do we only look to live for another day on this earth or to live with the Lord for eternity? Notice how controlled Jesus is in the midst of the mocking, shamefulness of being called a criminal, and the physical pain of crucifixion. Let us always take our trials and pain to the Cross of Christ and have Him redeem them through His own suffering, death, and Resurrection.

Thursday of this week is Thanksgiving Day. We will have our Mass at 9AM. During the Mass I will invite all present to offer a word of thanksgiving to God. I will also offer a blessing of any food you bring to the Church that will be served at your table. The offertory collection taken up at this Mass will be used to serve our social concern outreach to the poor.

May the peace of Christ rule your hearts, mind, and family. May you always know the love of Christ and share that love with others.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Catherine of Alexandria

C. 287-305

Feast Day - November 25

Catherine is thought to have been born to a noble family in Alexandria, Egypt. Through a vision, this scholarly young woman converted to Christianity and began evangelizing others, including the wife of the pagan emperor who was persecuting Christians. According to legend, after she defied the emperor and refuted philosophers brought in to test her faith, she was imprisoned and tortured. She was put on a rotating spiked wheel; when it broke, she was beheaded. She is venerated as the Great Martyr St. Catherine in the Orthodox tradition and her voice was among those heard by St. Joan of Arc. She is the patron saint of wheelwrights, and also a patron of jurists, philosophers, unmarried girls, students and teachers.

This course can be taken toward renewal requirements for VCEA licensure. Numerous high schools in the Archdiocese of Washington accept the course for CEU credits.



About the book:


