SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18

The Lord urges Moses to tell the Israelite Community to love their neighbors as themselves. They should bear no grudge or hatred against another.

SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 3:16-23

Paul, once again, reminds the Corinthians that they are the temple of God, and, as such, must avoid internal disputes and wrangling. He tries to make them realize that they belong to Christ and that the Spirit of God dwells within them.

Gospel: Matthew 5:38-48

In this part of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus exhorts his followers to do an extraordinary thing — to love their enemies and to pray for their oppressors. He reminds them that there is nothing laudatory in loving those who love them for even the "pagans" do this. He urges them to "turn the other cheek" and to "walk the extra mile."

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

Your response displayed the love that Christ has shown to us, and now you have shone to others. I want to especially thank our young people and young adults for their assistance and boundless energy.



February 22nd is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Services will be held at 8AM, 10:30AM with our School Community, and 7 PM. Ashes will be distributed during the Masses. On the Fridays of Lent, Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 7 PM in the Church.

Please remember the three hinges of Lent and of the Christian life: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. If you are looking for opportunities to deepen your personal relationship with the Lord, attend daily Mass at 8 AM here or at a Church nearby where you work. When one is fasting, it gives us an occasion to experience the hunger that is everyday lived out by over 34 million people in America and 828 million who experience food insufficiency in the world. We can also fast from pride, judgement of others, and the sins that hold us captive. By sharing our blessings, almsgiving, we can answer the needs of our parish, church, and world community. In the Gospel for the 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus calls us, "to be perfect, just as our heavenly Father is perfect." This can only happen as we give ourselves to the way of the Lord and humbly receive his grace.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence Guidelines

All Catholics from their 14th birthday until and including their 59th birthday are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. One full meal is allowed on the days of fast. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, are allowed. Together the two meals should not exceed the full meal. Drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. Catholics over the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES EFFORTS IN TURKEY & SYRIA

On February 6, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated large areas of central Turkey and northwest Syria. The death toll has surpassed 21,000 and continues to climb.

Across affected areas in both countries, apartment buildings and schools have been leveled. For Syrians, the damage took place in areas already devastated by years of war. In Turkey, the airports and the high roads of Anatolia are closed and most hospitals are unusable. Schools have been closed across the country.

Catholic Relief Services will support emergency relief efforts led by local partners in both Syria Turkey and with tas Internationalis, Caritas Syria in Aleppo and Lattakia-where extensive damage has been reported—and other local partners. Already in Turkey, tas Internationalis, in coordination with authorities, is bringing displaced people to safe, open spaces and distributing hot meals and clothing.

Your gifts will help partners to provide safe shelter, and access to food, clean water and hygiene supplies.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Peter Damian

988 – February 22, 1072

FEAST February 21

Peter escaped poverty and the neglect of his brother when his other brother, who was archpriest of Ravenna, took him under his wing. His brother sent him to good schools and Peter became a professor.

Soon, he decided to leave his teaching and give himself completely to prayer with the Benedictines of the reform of Saint Romuald at Fonte Avellana.

Pope Stephen IX made Peter the cardinal-bishop of Ostia. He worked to wipe out simony—the buying of church offices—and encouraged his priests to observe celibacy and urged even the diocesan clergy to live together and maintain scheduled prayer and religious observance.

He asked often to be allowed to retire as cardinal-bishop of Ostia, and finally Pope Alexander II consented, but he was still called to serve as a papal legate. He died on February 22, 1072. In 1828, he was declared a Doctor of the Church.


