Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We have come to Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. The crowd greeted Jesus with joy and exultations. Later this week they will call for His crucifixion. We are reminded of the parable of the sower who spread seeds on the ground, some fell on the path, some on rocky ground, some among thorns, and some on good soil. Is this not true of

us as well? We come to Church today and receive palms and them we turn from the Lord. The Lord is kind and merciful and calls each of us time and again. Let the palm you take and place in your home today be a reminder of the greatness of Jesus and His presence in your lives and homes.

I invite you to set aside time this week to attend each of the Holy Week services. Make this a blessed week for you and your family. Pray as an individual, as a family, and as members of Annunciation Catholic Church. Jesus has bound us together through His death and Resurrection.

On Holy Thursday, Jesus gave His apostles His Body and Blood under the form of bread and wine. Cardinal Gregory has given us permission to begin offering the Precious Blood to the faithful. Know that you are not obligated to drink from the Chalice. Receiving the Precious Blood offers a fuller expression of receiving the Lord in Holy Communion. In receiving Holy Communion under either of the forms, we receive the full body, blood, soul, and divinity of our Divine Savior. Going forward we will slowly reintroduce the possibility of receiving from the Chalice at Sunday Mass. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

- •are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- •were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- •were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

Children's CCD

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. It provides sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children in First through Eighth Grades.


INTERNATIONAL NIGHT





Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist: Unlocking the Secrets of the Last Supper by Brant Pitre is the book chosen for April.

Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist shines fresh light on the Last Supper by looking at it through Jewish eyes. Using his in-depth knowledge of the Bible and ancient Judaism, Dr. Brant Pitre answers questions such as: What was the Passover like at the time of Jesus? What were the Jewish hopes for the Messiah? What was Jesus' purpose in instituting the Eucharist during the feast of Passover? And, most important of all, what did Jesus mean when he said, "This is my body... This is my blood"?

To answer these questions, Pitre explores ancient Jewish beliefs about the Passover of the Messiah, the miraculous Manna from heaven, and the mysterious Bread of the Presence. As he shows, these three keys—the Passover, the Manna, and the Bread of the Presence—have the power to unlock the original meaning of the Eucharistic words of Jesus. Along the way, Pitre also explains how Jesus united the Last Supper to his death on Good Friday and his Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Inspiring and informative, Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist is a groundbreaking work that is sure to illuminate one of the greatest mysteries of the Christian faith: the mystery of Jesus' presence in "the breaking of the bread."
