The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

- •are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- •were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- •were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. 

PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

The meeting began with prayer at 7:10 pm on Tuesday, May 30th. Monsignor Mellone, John Gay, Ron Silvestri, and Anita Siegfriedt were in attendance.

Several people are considering becoming members of the council.

An Australian priest coming in August for studies at Georgetown on Muslim-Christian relations will be with us at Annunciation for at least a year.

The expanded coffee and donut ministry is going well. There have been some additional volunteers, but more are needed. Anita Siegfriedt has made a checklist for tasks to help new volunteers learn the ropes. Donuts will be available after all three Masses on Father's Day (Sunday, June 18).

The 75th anniversary Mass, procession, and picnic on Corpus Christi (June 11) is taking shape. The Holy Father has sent his Apostolic Blessing for the occasion. Many beloved former priests will be in attendance at the noon Mass, with at least nine concelebrants. The picnic will feature barbecue from Red Hot and Blue and a square-dancing demonstration.

After the Corpus Christi festivities, the next major occasion for the 75th anniversary celebration will be the gala on October 7.

The council discussed how to end the 75th year celebration at next year's Solemnity of the Annunciation.

The council discussed efforts to better reflect the diversity of our parish in our ministries.



Are you looking for ways to help support migrant families in DC? Join Catholic Charities on June 17th for a Summer Clothing and Shoes Drive!

Over the past year, thousands of migrant families have been bussed from the Southern Border to the District of Columbia. Catholic Charities Archdiocese of Washington D.C. is providing 372 families (comprised of over 1,300 people) of newly arrived migrants with basic necessities and shelter. Half of these people are children. Many families arrived in D.C. with only the clothes on their backs and very few other personal belongings.

As the seasons rapidly transition to Summer, there is an obvious need we can all help to address: access to Summer clothing and shoes.

On June 17th, from 10am-2pm at Anchor Mental Health, Catholic Charities ADW will be hosting a Summer Clothes and Shoes Drive. Any donation of new or professionally cleaned clothing or shoes, no matter how big or small, will make a difference.

- t-shirts: any short-sleeved or T-shirt will work,
- shorts: biker/athletic shorts, and
