Becoming Catholic

If you are interested in becoming a Catholic, join RCIA.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

- are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. It provides sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children in First through Eighth Grades.

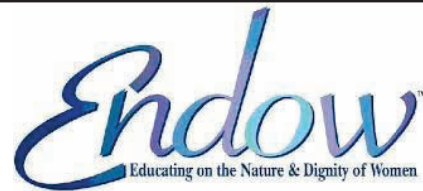

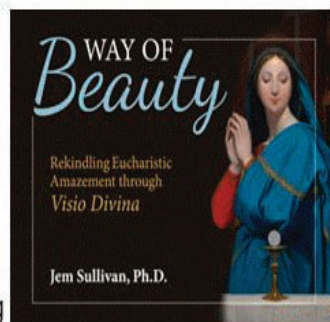

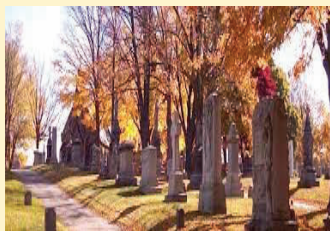
Sacramental Celebrations

PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

The meeting came to order on June 27, 2023, at 7:05pm. Monsignor Mellone, Kathy, Joe, John, and Anita attended.

The council welcomed Kathy Curran as a new member. The council discussed several other additional members.

The 75th anniversary Mass, Corpus Christi procession, and picnic were successful and well attended. The council expressed gratitude to the planning committee and discussed holding another procession and celebration next year at the Annunciation feast day or Corpus Christi. The council discussed assessing future procession routes for low-hanging branches that could interfere with the canopy. The Council discussed processing to or from one of the nearby parishes next time.

Monsignor Mellone reported that mass attendance has been doing well - consistently around eighty people at the 8am mass, and multiple hundreds at the 10am and 12pm masses.

The electronics for the new carillon are operational, with music downloaded. The console is still to be set up; once it is ready, we will debut the instrument.

The frames for the new Stations of the Cross are under contract and should be done by the end of August. A few stations are still available for dedication. The council discussed whether the old stations can be donated to a parish in Haiti, but there are questions of canon law to be resolved.

The council discussed leftover donut volumes.

The council discussed the potential resurfacing of the parking lot.

The council discussed holding a silent auction and other fundraising ideas.

The council discussed the October 7th 75th Anniversary Gala.

The council agreed to reconvene in September.

The meeting closed with prayer at 8:25pm.

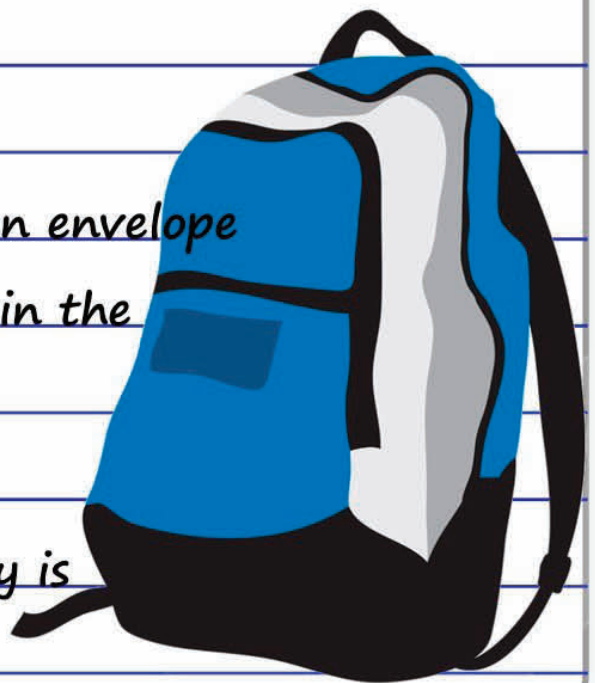

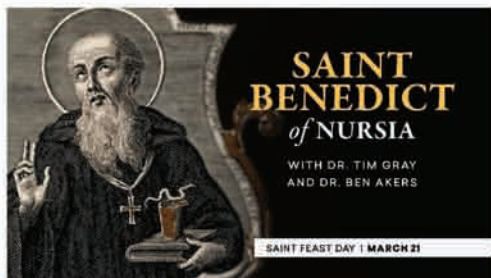
