Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Last week's reading from St. Paul's letter to the Romans said, "How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways!" St Paul was providing insight into the mystery of God. God is so other than ourselves it is impossible to know the mind of God unless He reveals himself to us.



In this Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 16:21-27, Jesus shares with his disciples that he must suffer, be killed, and be raised on the third day. This message is beyond the disciples understanding. The disciples have seen Jesus perform incredible miracles, he has stated he is the Christ, the Son of God. This is what St. Paul means by the phrase, "how unsearchable his ways." How can the Son of God be killed? Peter is unwilling to accept this and even tempts Jesus to turn away from the will of his Heavenly Father.

We witness the example of many people, including St. Peter, who begin to think as God desires. Taking up our personal cross and bearing it with grace and humility unites us to the will of God. It becomes not only a blessing for us but an example which blesses others. Their faith strengthens ours and our faith strengthens others. By accepting the will of God in our lives we become united to our heavenly Father and live as his sons and daughters. Challenging as this is, it is the way to eternal life.

Becoming Catholic

If you are interested in becoming a Catholic, join RCIA.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

- •are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- •were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- •were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

Children's CCD

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. It provides sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children in First through Eighth Grades.








ARE YOU SOMEONE OR DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO...




BLESSED SACRAMENT BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUP






