#### THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4A, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra gathered the people and read to them from the book of the Law of God. He interpreted the law clearly, so that everyone understood what he had read. He then told them to go and rejoice in the Lord.

#### SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 12:12-30

Paul explains that a body is composed of many different parts, and that each part has its own purpose and is important. He compares this to the Church, describing how we are one body composed of many members. All members should show concern for each other and understand that we are all vital to the body as a whole.

#### GOSPEL: LUKE 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke discusses his decision to write about the events he and the other disciples had witnessed. He begins by telling of Jesus reading a passage from the book of Isaiah, where the anointed one is portrayed. Jesus finished by telling the people that they had seen that passage fulfilled in their hearing.

#### Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

In today's second reading from Saint Paul's first letter to the Corinthians 12:12-30, we have a great insight not just to the unity of the body but to the Church united in the Holy Spirit in light of diversity. The analogy of the body to society was well known throughout the ancient world in literature and politics. Saint Paul makes the distinction that the lesser



members are not there to serve the greater members of society, but all parts of the body serve the common good of the body of Christ and therefore, the Church. He was attempting to correct the false notion that speaking in tongues was a greater gift than healing, mighty deeds, prophesy, and interpreting tongues. All these gifts of the Spirit are needed for the good of the assembly of the Church. We might ask ourselves, "What are the gifts I have received from the Lord? How do I use them not only for my good but more importantly for the good of my family, society and the Church?" No matter which gift(s) you may have been blest with from the Lord, it is to be used for the good of others. Our diversity is not a weakness but a blessing, our differences are not a curse but an opportunity to see the many facets of God's immeasurable love. Jesus quotes Isaiah, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor: He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK



## John Bosco 1815-1888

FEAST JANUARY 31

Born to a poor family in Italy, this patron saint of editors and laborers is considered one of the great social saints. Ordained a priest in 1841, he was sent to study theology in Turin, where he became a magnet for neglected youths during a turbulent period of rapid industrialization and revolutionary politics. Don Bosco, who once hoped to become a foreign missionary, founded the Salesians in 1854. The order sheltered more than 800 orphan boys, then opened workshops for shoemakers, tailors, bookbinders and other trades. Don Bosco was also a prolific writer, and co-founded a women's congregation to work among girls. When he died, more than 40,000 people in Turin filed past his coffin to show their love and respect.




