# TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Jeremiah 20:10-13

Because the prophet Jeremiah foretold disaster for Jerusalem, he was denounced. But Jeremiah trusted in the Lord and overcame his persecutors.

#### SECOND READING: ROMANS 5:12-15

Paul explains to the Romans that Adam's sin brought death to all, but Christ's gift of himself brought grace and life.

#### Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33

In authoritative and encouraging words, Jesus urges the apostles to fear nothing -- only him who can destroy the soul. Telling them "every hair of your head has been counted," he promises that "Whoever acknowledges me before men I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven."

# CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

**BAPTISM:** The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

**CONFIRMATION:** "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

**MATRIMONY:** Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS:** For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

# Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I hope you have been doing well during these many months of not having been able to attend Sunday Mass. You have certainly been in our prayers and Fr. Jack and I wish to thank you for yours. Please remember we are open to hearing from each of you to answer questions or help with the challenges you are facing. For those who were able to donate food this past weekend I wish to express my



sincerest thanks. It was a great success. Your generosity was tremendous.

You may have heard that the Mayor, as of June 22<sup>nd</sup> will allow up to 100 people in worship services with social distancing. For us at Annunciation that would mean up to 80 people in the body of the Church including choir loft. Shortly you will be receiving a video that shows how to enter Church, how you will be seated, Communion procession and how to exit. All these processes will need to be followed for the good of all. I know you have witnessed people who do not follow directions regarding parking spaces, travel lanes, texting while driving and on and on. They say, "This doesn't mean me. It's for the other person." Well our directions will be for all attending the parish church. Please be courteous, especially to our volunteer parishioners. Words like, "Please, Thank you, and You are welcome, go a long way to building harmony and peace. The weekend of June 26/27 we will begin having the following Mass schedule of 5:30 Saturday evening, Sunday: 8 am, 10 am and 12 pm. We will have a signup procedure through Flocknotes. People who do not have internet access will be able to call the rectory to register for a particular Mass. This will only apply for the Sunday Masses; this will not apply for the weekday Masses. If you have not notified the Rectory Office of your email please do so this week. We ask that you please bring and wear your mask before entering the Church and throughout the mass, as well as use your own hand sanitizer.

Weekday Masses will be 8am and 11am Monday through Friday and Saturday at 9am. We will have confessions in the Chapel on Wednesdays 11:30am to 12:30pm and Saturdays from 4:15pm to 5:15pm.

On Saturday June 19th, eight men are scheduled to be ordained to the priest-hood for the Archdiocese of Washington. One of them will be assigned to our parish. Please pray for all of them and thank God for his blessings on the Church of Washington.

# **THOMAS MORE**

c. 1478-1535

#### FEAST JUNE 22

Born in London, Thomas studied at Oxford, married and had four children. King Henry VIII took this brilliant lawyer into his service in 1518, knighted him and named him lord chancellor. But Thomas broke with the king when he divorced Catherine of Aragon and set himself up as supreme head of the church in England. In 1532 Thomas resigned his post, and in 1534 was arrested when he refused to take the oath to the new Act of Succession. Imprisoned for more than a year in the Tower of London, he was convicted of treason and beheaded.






