SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

GOSPEL: LUKE 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The three major religions: Christianity, Islam, and Judaism all hold Abraham as a foundation figure in their traditions. He is revered as a Father in Faith. Abraham responded to the Lord's call to move from his homeland to the place where the Lord God would lead him and his family. Saying yes to the Lord and



trusting in God, he journeyed to a place he did not know. Abraham had settled in the Hebron area and bought a cave as a burial site for the Patriarchs: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and their wives.

Our first reading from Genesis 18:1-10a tells us of an encounter with the Lord, coming to Abraham as strangers. Abraham reaches out to these strangers and provides them with water, shade, and food. In return, they promise Sarah she will give birth to a son, Isaac. We can draw a lesson from this story of faith, similar to last week's Gospel of the Good Samaritan, of reaching out to the stranger with compassion and not worrying about the cost. The Gospel for the 16th Sunday of Ordinary Time also expresses the truth that we are to attend to the commands of the Lord and His direction in our lives rather than worry about many other things. Mary centers her life on listening to the words of Jesus while Martha attends to the physical needs of Jesus and His disciples. Both are important, but if one needs to make a choice at a particular moment, we need to abide by the Lord's call to us at this moment. It may be to serve or it may be listen, but it is always to be what the Lord asks of us.

What is the Lord asking of you today? How do you hear His voice? Where will you serve the Lord and the stranger? Know that the Lord will bless us with His unbounded love and generosity.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



MARY MAGDALENE

First Century

FEAST JULY 22

Mary, from Magdala in Galilee, was a disciple of Jesus who used her resources, or wealth, to help support him and his followers. The Gospel of Luke also says Mary was the woman from whom Jesus cast out seven demons and that she was present at his crucifixion and burial. In all four Gospels, Mary was the first witness to the Resurrection and carried that news to the others; because of this, St. Augustine called her "apostola apostolorum" the apostle to the apostles. Traditions that identified Mary as a prostitute or a penitent sinner are now discounted.

Annunciation Parish Council Minutes

The meeting opened with prayer on June 28 at 7:04pm. Monsignor Mellone, Joe, John, Art, and Tom attended.

The school had a table at Glover Park Day, but with limited presence due to the day coinciding with ACS graduation. Future iterations may need more parishioner presence to balance this, as this is when the ACS graduation tends to be.

The building leak remains unsolved as of this morning.

We are seeking a timeline for the completion of the carillon, aiming for end of August. We will need confidence in the date if the Cardinal is to bless the addition and the carillon shortly after.

Father Grzegorz has left for his new parish. Father Adam Park, returned from Rome, will be doing some Masses at Annunciation.

Joe trimmed the bushes blocking the sign in front of the church. David will be assessing the wiring for lighting possibilities; the Church will also evaluate getting a new sign.

Tom suggested an Advent event, perhaps a week or so before Christmas, with a short, liturgy-like set of readings and songs in the darkened church, and perhaps the blessing of the creche, followed by a procession into the parish hall for cookies, punch, and carols.

The Council will next meet September 27th.

The meeting closed with prayer at 7:39pm.







About the book (from the dust jacket):

For many Catholics today, the Eucharist is merely a symbol of Christ, and the Mass is merely a collectivity of like-minded individuals gathering to remember his life.
