# TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### FIRST READING: DEUTERONOMY 4:1-2, 6-8

Moses tells the people to always observe the statutes God has given them, without adding or subtracting from these laws. He reminds them that the law is just, and that any nation who heard their statutes would consider them a wise nation.

## SECOND READING: JAMES 1:17-18, 21B-22, 27

James discusses the gifts that God has given to all people and implores them to respond by welcoming the words of truth that can save them. He emphasizes that through good deeds and pure conduct, our faith in God is proven to him.

#### GOSPEL: MARK 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Pharisees observed some of Jesus' disciples eating without first purifying their hands and ask the disciples why they are going against their ancestor's traditions. Jesus responds that nothing from the outside can make a person impure. The only true evil, acts such as fornication, murder, and greed among others, come from within and make a person impure.

# **CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS**

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

# **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners,

Both Fr. Andrew and I appreciate all the support and encouragement you have offered us during this most difficult time in our Church history. It is shameful to face the horrific sins that have been perpetrated on innocent people, our youth. As I wrote earlier, this type of abuse has occurred within my own family, but not by a priest. I know firsthand that not only the abused child suffers but also the



parents, family members, future children and grandchildren. Abuse of children often passes on from one generation to the next.

In my column in last week's bulletin I received feedback from many parishioners asking the question, "Why should I pray, fast or give alms in reparation for the sins of another? I have not done anything wrong." I completely understand this response and I do not fault anyone for having these thoughts and feelings. In the past several weeks, we have been reflecting on the 6th Chapter of John's Gospel and have a greater awareness that we are one in Christ, we are one body in the Lord. My prayers and sacrifices are not just for me but for all people. Christ suffered and died not only for those who loved Him but also for those who did not love Him.

In my own mind and heart I know my sins have caused harm to the people of God even if no one knows of my sins. We strive as God's people to build up the body of Christ through our sacrifices and prayers. Your prayers and sacrifices strengthen me; your faith gives me the courage to move on to do better. I see us as supporting one another. Our model is Christ Jesus. "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God", 2 Corinthians 5:21. Christ died for all of us so that we might become right with God. He is the perfect sacrifice offered to the Father. I ask for your prayers and I assure you that I will be praying for you.

On a different note, I wish to thank all of you who have welcomed me into your family here at Annunciation Catholic Church. I have found this to be a most welcoming and joyful community. I thank my brother priests Fr. Andrew and Msgr. Charles for helping me get settled and making this a new home for me. I have found the parish staff to be most gracious and supportive. I will strive to do my best to be an imitator of Christ and fulfill the mission that He has given me at Annunciation.

# TERESA OF KOLKATA

1910-1997

#### FEAST SEPTEMBER 7

Raised in a deeply Catholic family in Albania, Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu joined the Sisters of Loreto in 1928 and took the name Teresa. The community sent her to Kolkata, India, where she taught children for two decades. In 1946 Teresa heard God's call to quench the thirst of Jesus by caring for the poorest of the poor. She left the Sisters of Loreto to rescue the sick and destitute in the slums of Kolkata - one at a time. Many volunteers soon joined her and she formed them into her religious order, the Missionaries of Charity. Teresa's manifest goodness and her unique media savvy attracted global attention, drawing many people to God. Many regard her as the greatest Catholic evangelist of the 20th century. She was beatified in 2003 and canonized in 2016.






