FIRST READING: EZEKIEL 18:25-28

Ezekiel reminds the people that if a sinner turns away from his iniquity, he will live, not die.

Paul urges the converts at Philippi to be united in spirit and ideals, avoiding rivalry and dissension. He ends with the beautiful hymn extolling the humility and sacrifice of Christ.

GOSPEL: MATTHEW 21:28-32

Jesus speaks words of rebuke to the chief priests and the elders because they are not believing the teachings of John the Baptist. He warns them that tax collectors and prostitutes, who do believe John, will enter the Kingdom of God before them.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Let me begin by thanking you for all the kindnesses and generosities you have extended to me and the parish. We have all needed to stretch ourselves in many directions during this most unusual of times. I don't think the Lord is



done with us quite yet. Just a few examples of what we have been through: World Wide Pandemic in which more the 972 thousand people have died, education on all levels disrupted, isolation from family and friends, wildfires burning over 4,000,000 acres in the United States, so many storms, economic downfall, social unrest and political upheaval. It's quite a list and I am sure you can add to it. But in the last several months I have personally witnessed, Baptisms, Weddings, First Communions, Ordinations, outpouring of food donations, new people registering at the parish, an increase in Mass attendance, and the generous sacrifices of people toward other people. We live in what people call a "Post Christian Era." Yet, I see this as a time for a genuine personal response to faith in Jesus Christ. It would be really great if we had the support of society and culture, but we do not. We live in an era when we, as Catholics, are seen as Counter Cultural. This is not a bad thing. It calls for us to deepen our faith in Christ Jesus and to sharpen our wits to engage, with charity, the world in which we live. Paul's letter to the Philippians 2:1-11 should be a great encouragement for us. We live for Christ and model for others the joy of self-sacrifice, "to the glory of God the Father."

Friday, September 25, was the last day to return the Parish Survey that was sent out two weeks ago. Thank you for all who have taken the time to fill it out and returned it to the parish. The Pastoral Council will be looking and the responses and advising the pastoral staff on how we are to proceed.

SAINT MICHAEL, SAINT GABRIEL & SAINT RAPHAEL

FEAST DAY - SEPTEMBER 29

These archangels, messengers sent by God, are the only ones named in the Bible. In the Book of Daniel, Michael is called "the great prince"; in the Letter of Jude, he argues with the devil over Moses' body; and in the Book of Revelation, he leads the battle against Satan. He is patron of the sick, radiologists and mariners. Gabriel explains Daniel's visions to him in the Book of Daniel, and in the Gospel of Luke announces to Zechariah and Mary the births of their respective sons. He is the patron of messengers telecommunications and postal workers. Raphael guides Tobiah in the Book of Tobit; he is patron of the blind, physicians and travelers. The church created their joint feast after the Second Vatican Council.
