

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Elisha cures Naaman of leprosy, which convinces Naaman that there is only one God. Naaman then asks to take some loads of soil from Israel, so that he can worship and make sacrifices to one true God on his own land.

SECOND READING: 2 TIMOTHY 2:8-13

Paul reminds Timothy that Christ rose from the dead so that many people could be saved. Paul was being treated as a criminal and kept in chains but says. "There is no chaining the word of God!" Paul also says, "if we die in Christ, we will live in him. But if we deny him, he will deny us."

GOSPEL: LUKE 17:11-19

Jesus cures ten lepers, but only one returns to express gratitude for being healed. Jesus is disappointed that only one gave thanks to God, but tells that one, "Your faith has been your salvation."

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Leprosy, which we now know as Hansen's disease, is difficult to catch and spread. It is readily treated to-day with antibiotics. Leprosy in biblical times was not the disease we know today. Whatever the disease was, it resulted in isolation from the community, synagogue, and family. It was looked upon as a punishment from the Lord. That is why a priest was needed to pronounce the person clean or unclean.



The main point of the gospel passage was to show, along with our first reading, that God loves and cares for all people whether they were of Jewish descent or not. All of us are called to give thanks to God. Many times we turn to the Lord in our need and he responds to our prayers. Sometimes that response is not what we want but what we need. It still gives us the opportunity to thank God. This may be a challenge for some of us because we find ourselves trying to control our own lives rather that submitting to the will of God. I pray that all of us will return to God and give thanks no matter where we stand in our spiritual journey, for he accepts us where we are and helps us to move closer to him.

We have the opportunity to give thanks to God on Wednesday evenings beginning with Mass at 5:30 and spending an hour in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration, 6 pm to 7 pm. The Sacrament of Confession is also offered during that time frame.



SAINTS OF THE WEEK



St. John XXIII, Pope

1881-1963

Feast-October 11th

Born into a farming family in Sotto il Monte in northern Italy in 1881, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was ordained a priest in 1904. With the help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people during World War II. Named a cardinal in 1953, he was elected Pope in 1958 at age 78. He took the name John after his father and the two patrons of Rome's cathedral, St. John Lateran. He convoked (1959) the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). "Good Pope John" died of stomach cancer in June 1963. His feast day recalls the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council (1962). Declared a Blessed in 2000, he was canonized, together with Pope John Paul II, by Pope Francis in April 2014.

Annunciation Pastoral Council Minutes

The meeting came to order on September 27, 2022, around 7pm with prayer. Monsignor Mellone, Joe, John, Tom, Anita, and Ron were in attendance.

Building: Leak is from Parish Center, draining to sump pump.

The council discussed liturgy and music.

The council discussed a suggestion to move the baptismal font into the chapel.

The council discussed how to commemorate the coming 75th anniversary of the parish in June 2023, including options like a social gathering, food, a potluck, a commemorative booklet on the new bells, combining this with a Corpus Christi celebration, and getting a carillon player. The council members were asked to come up with ideas and recommendations ahead of the next meeting.

An investigation into adding handrails to the sanctuary found it would be too costly.

The carillon is now in St. Louis getting its finishing touches.

The council discussed a Corpus Christi procession from both St. Ann's and St. Thomas.

Unbound and the Little Sisters of the Poor will be coming in the next months.

The Council discussed promotion for the coming Roth Concert.

The meeting closed with prayer around 8pm.


A Way To Help Yourself and Your Church




John XXIII: The Pope of Peace
