Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Recently I have received several questions regarding Catholic burial rites and how to show respect and care for a baptized Catholic. At the heart of care for those who have died is that we believe in the Resurrection of the Dead. This we profess at eve-

ry Mass when we pray the Nicene Creed. As Catholics we believe that God cares for us when we are alive or dead. We belong to the Communion of Saints who are living in Heaven, being purified in Purgatory, or living here on earth. Before the time of Jesus here on earth the Hebrew people acknowledged their respect for the dead. That is why Jesus' body was placed in a tomb. When Jesus rose from the dead the early Christians believed that the followers of Jesus would also participate in the Resurrection, body and soul, and live for eternity with the Lord in Heaven.

A number of other cultures would often burn the bodies of the dead as a way of saying that the deceased no longer exists. As Catholics we believe that our souls continue to live on even though our bodies decay. Presently, cremation is permitted by the Church as long as it is not seen as opposed to the Resurrection.

Whether the deceased is to be buried or cremated, their remains should be entombed in the ground, a mausoleum, or a columbarium. This is one of the Corporal Works of Mercy. It also provides a memorial place for family, friends, and the community to gather and pray for their Christian brothers and sisters, especially on All Souls day. It is important to entomb all of the person's cremains in one place and not to divide them up among family members or places. This is a matter of respect for their body which was created by the Lord God. Becoming Catholic

If you are interested in becoming a Catholic, join RCIA.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

- •are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- •were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- •were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

Children's CCD

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. It provides sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children in First through Eighth Grades.




