Lenten Fast and Abstinence Guidelines

All Catholics from their 14th birthday until and including their 59th birthday are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. One full meal is allowed on the days of fast. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, are allowed. Together the two meals should not exceed the full meal. Drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. Catholics over the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent.

If you are interested in becoming a Catholic, join RCIA.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a gradual process of spiritual formation that includes prayer, sharing, and study and occurs in the context of the parish community. It is intended for adults who:

- •are not baptized and would like to be fully initiated and welcomed into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- •were baptized in another Christian community/tradition and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- •were baptized as Catholics as infants/children but have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

RCIA Meetings take place on Mondays from 7-8:30pm.

Children's CCD

The Children's Faith Formation program exists to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ in the context of the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. It provides sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation as well as ongoing faith formation for children in First through Eighth Grades.

PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

The Council came to order with prayer at 7:05 pm. Msgr. Watkins, Kip, Kathy, Anita and John attended.

The Council sought a status update on the finalization of the carillon and the improvements to the Stations of the Cross. The Council also sought an update on the results of October's parish count.

The Council discussed the Advent/Immaculate Conception celebration, observing that it was very well attended and seemed to be widely enjoyed, and discussed plans for holding it again in 2024, perhaps for the Feast of St. Nicholas.

The Council discussed several issues with the parish's physical facilities and how to prioritize among remedies, noting in particular the lighting in the parking lot, the sinking in the parking lot, bad acoustics in the parish center, problems with the kitchen, and ducting issues in the parish center.

The Council discussed the success of the Christmas bazaar.

The Council discussed signage to promote ministries in the parish, perhaps via bulletin boards in the Parish Center and the parking lot entrance area.

The Council discussed establishing a welcoming and engagement committee.

The Council discussed having a Sunday where everyone gets a nametag so people can learn the names of fellow parishioners they may have met but whose names they have forgotten.

The Council tentatively selected April 14 for a ministry fair to promote participation in various ministries and communities in the parish, especially those facing shortages, like altar servers.

The Council discussed preparing for Lent and Easter, including the possibility of a parish mission or parish retreat and the Council's annual egg hunt.

The Council discussed other upcoming events like International Night and potential future events like another Corpus Christi procession and a May crowning.

The Council discussed possible ways to show support for the Jewish communities in our parish boundaries.

The Council discussed holding a healing Mass aimed at various local, national, and global wounds.

The Council closed with prayer at 8:25pm.

ANNUNCIATION BOOK CLUB



The book chosen for February is Sisters: The Extraordinary Lives of Serena and Anna Marie Branson by Chris Byrd.

Sisters tells the stories of Chris' aunts, Sisters Serena and Anna Marie Branson. Daughters of Charity, their examples informed his desire to become a gospel person, who lives simply, works for justice, promotes peace, and respects lives at all stages and situations.

Serena was:

- The first woman in the Unites States to run a Catholic agency, Catholic Charities of Albany, which she led from 1974-1990, increasing its annual budget from \$500,000 to \$19 million.
- Frequently honored for her 72 years of service and advocacy, most notably Catholic Charities USA's highest honor—it's Vision Award—in 2002.

Anna Marie was:

- A missionary who served her final 20 years among Bolivia's indigenous poor.
- Regarded as a saint, for the heroic way she ignored her failing health to serve out her great love for God's poor. Sisters will promote her sainthood cause.
