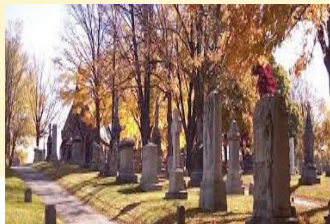
## Sacramental Celebrations

## PRAY WITH SCRIPTURE

### First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

### Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

### Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.

## THANK YOU FROM HOLY REDEEMER

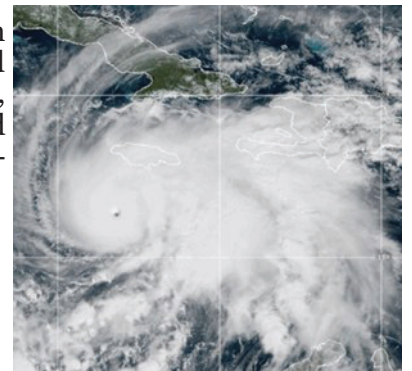

## CRS DONATIONS FOR HURRICANE MELISSA RELIEF

The path of destruction from Hurricane Melissa includes Jamaica, and then northward to Cuba, the Bahamas and Bermuda. The Dominican Republic and Haiti, while not in the direct path, have also been impacted. Damaging winds, severe flooding, and mudslides have destroyed homes and other structures, and have blocked roads causing widespread power outages, communications failures, and impacted the availability of clean drinkable water.



Cardinal McElroy has asked that we support the recovery efforts.

- **Shelter**—Tarps, bedding and other materials for emergency protection, plus support for shelter providers.
- **Food and essential supplies**—Cash assistance and direct distribution of food and essentials.

- **Emotional and mental health support**—Psychological first aid and help for families coping with loss.
- **Long-term recovery**—Support for families and communities to rebuild homes and livelihoods.

New volunteers are needed for the 2026 tax season to help prepare returns, and for non-tax positions: greeters, interpreters, and schedulers. All preparer volunteers must attend training on Saturdays in January and pass a brief online certification test before our February 1 start. We will have experienced tax volunteers on-site to assist return preparers and to provide a detailed review of each return. 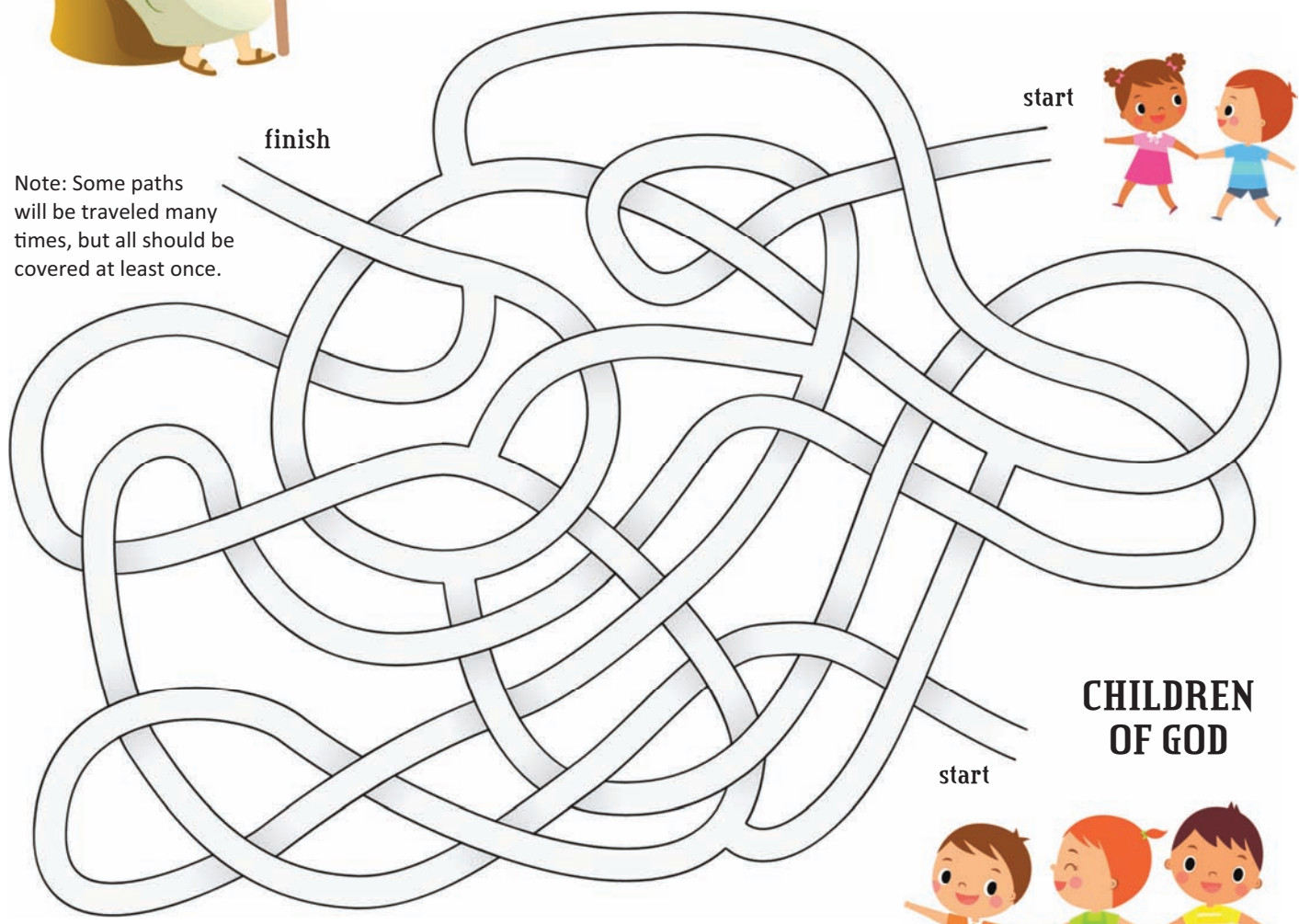


# HEAVEN
